The average cost of full-time infant care in Texas for a single child is \$8,495 each year, according to a Boston Globe article on the cost of daycare by state.

In some communities west of Houston, this expense is more burdensome than others. Take Rosenburg, for example, where the average household income is about \$47,000 according to U.S. Census data — meaning daycare costs nearly 20% of this income for just one child.

Northwest in Katy, the average household income sits higher at \$71,000, according to U.S. Census data. Yet, the cost of daycare for a single child of these families still takes more than 10 percent of this income.

At Annie's Precious Angels, we recognize the burden this expense can place on families and feel every person has the right to access quality care and education for their children. Our center aims to provide this essential opportunity to communities most in need, focused on creating a stimulating, creative, positive and secure learning environment to develop the children's overall skills and self-concept.

Much research exists about the essential brain development that happens in children beginning at birth and in those first formative years. A report from UNICEF on early childhood development reported "considerable evidence showing infants exposed to good nutrition and adequate psychosocial stimulation had measurably better brain function at twelve years of age than those raised in a less stimulating environment."

Parents who leave their children in others' care deserve to know their children is offered the opportunity to grow into their potential. We believe we can bridge a gap for families struggling to access this level of impact.

Our center will organize events such as food drives or other fundraisers to help feed and clothe the homeless, or support others in need. We will focus on helping women of color to provide for themselves and their families through job application and interview support.

The truth is, more and more households operate on a dual income. As of 2012, in about 60% of households with children under the age 18 both parents were employed, according to <u>data</u> <u>from the Pew Research Center</u>. In the 1960s, only 25% of these households held dual employment; generally, the father was the only one with a job (70%).

With both parents now busy with full-time employment, quality daycare options are critical to establish this positive base in young lives.
